Dr. Melissa Forgie – Chair of the Board

Dr. Forgie is a graduate of the University of Ottawa's medical school and has Royal College specializations in Internal Medicine and in Hematology. She has a fellowship in Thromboembolic Disorders and a Master's in clinical epidemiology and is a clinician investigator with the Ottawa Hospital Research Institute. She is a Professor of Medicine. She is Senior Vice Dean and Vice President, Medical Education at the Faculty of Medicine, University of Ottawa, and The Ottawa Hospital. Her clinical practice specializes in thromboembolic diseases. In her previous capacity as Vice-Dean, Undergraduate Medical Education, she has received recognition for her advocacy for and assessment of the learning environment and developed a program for social accountability for the MD program, which encompasses humanities, community service learning, global health, leadership and social determinants of health sub programs. She has publications in a wide array of prestigious journals such as the New England Journal of Medicine and Nature and continues to publish in her area of clinical expertise. She was appointed to the Board of Governors of the Youth Services Bureau in 2020.
