

Grade 11 is the first of two Specialization Years. Students develop an increasingly individual approach to their studies based on their academic strengths and interests, and intended concentration at university.

Students in Grade 11 take 7-8 credit courses. All students take a mandatory IB English course (Higher or Standard Level) as well as a mathematics course. The remaining 5-6 courses are electives with up to 3 taken at the IB level. Students require 30 credits to graduate with an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). For students interested in the IB Diploma program, please refer to the IB Diploma course selection form.

Reach Ahead: Some students take summer school courses to reach ahead or to redo courses and that may alter the above progression. However, students **MUST** graduate with at least 30 credits that include the 18 compulsory credits required for the OSSD and must take their 30th credit at Ashbury. We prefer that students have 31 credits by the end of Grade 12. Reach ahead credits cannot be used to reduce the expected minimum course load.

IB Courses: Students not enrolled in the full IB Diploma program may choose to take some IB courses. These are two-year courses at the end of which students write an IB exam. In consultation with their Academic Advisor, students determine if they will take a higher level (HL) or standard level (SL) IB course.

Ashbury Diploma: Grade 11 students may choose to satisfy the **global studies** requirement this year by selecting one of the following OSSD courses – CGW4U/F, CHY4U, CIA4U – or one or more of the following IB courses - CHY4UB, CPW4UB.

There are other courses open to students in their Grade 12 year that also satisfy the requirement – CGR4MB (CGF3M or SBI3U strongly recommended), CIA4UB (CIE3MB strongly recommended).

Ashbury Bilingual Certificate: Grade 11 students concurrently enrolled in Extended or Immersion French may select one or both of the following elective courses to fulfill the 8 courses required for the Bilingual Certificate – CGW4UF, HSB4UF.

***New Students:** The academic records of new Grade 11 students are reviewed by the Academic Advisor during course selection. Students are typically awarded 16 or more equivalency credits upon entry (for study completed outside Ontario) and must complete 14 credits over two years to satisfy the OSSD requirement. Ashbury Diploma requirements are reviewed on an individual basis.

New students will be placed in Grade 11 Functions (MCR3U). If they wish to be placed in grade 12 Advanced Functions (MHF4U), a diagnostic test will be required the week prior to the start of school or during the first week of school to determine suitability.

Some students take an ESL course in Grade 11 to further develop their English language skills. A diagnostic test will be required at the beginning of the year to determine which ESL level is most suitable.
