

## COVID-19 Screening Tool for STUDENTS of Ashbury College

The purpose of this Screening Tool is to help you decide if you may attend school or not.

**This screening tool must be completed before entering the school.**

1. Are you **fully vaccinated** against COVID-19? (fully vaccinated refers to the full series of a COVID-19 vaccine authorized by Health Canada)

The reason we ask this question is because the guidelines are different for vaccinated/not fully vaccinated students. Read the remaining questions carefully.

2. In the last **5 days (10 days if you are not fully vaccinated)**, have you experienced any of these symptoms?

Choose any/all that are new, worsening, and not related to other known causes or conditions you already have.

Select "None of the above" if symptoms have been improving for 24 hours and you tested negative for COVID-19 on a single PCR test or two rapid antigen tests taken 24 to 48 hours apart.

Anyone who is sick or has any symptoms of illness, including those not listed below, should stay home until their symptoms are improving for 24 hours and seek assessment from their health care provider if needed.

- Fever and/or chills (37.8 ° Celsius/100 ° Fahrenheit or higher.)
- Cough or barking cough (croup) (Continuous, making a whistling noise when breathing)
- Shortness of breath (Out of breath, unable to breathe deeply)
- Decrease or loss of taste or smell
- Nausea, vomiting and/or diarrhea (not related to irritable bowel syndrome, anxiety, menstrual cramps)
- Sore throat (Painful swallowing or difficulty swallowing)
- Runny or stuffy/congested nose
- Headache (New and persistent, unusual, unexplained, or long-lasting)
- Muscle aches and pains (That is unexplained or unusual)
- Extreme tiredness, lack of energy or feeling unwell (That is unusual or unexpected)

3. Do any of the following international travel scenarios apply to you? In the last 14 days:

- you travelled outside of Canada and were told to quarantine
- you travelled outside of Canada and told to not attend school
- someone you live with returned from outside Canada and is isolating while waiting for COVID-19 test results

If a child/student is not fully vaccinated but is exempt from federal quarantine because they travelled with a fully vaccinated companion, they must not go to school for 14 days. Select "Yes" if this applies.

4. **Has a doctor, health care provider, or public health unit told you that you should currently be isolating or staying at home?** This can be because of an outbreak, contact tracing, or after testing positive on a rapid antigen test.

If you answered “Yes”, you MAY NOT enter the school today.

5. In the last **5 days (10 days if you are not fully vaccinated)**, have you tested positive for Covid – 19? This includes a positive COVID-19 test result on a lab-based PCR test, rapid antigen test, or home-based self-testing kit.

If you answered “Yes”, you MAY NOT enter the school today.

6. **Do any of the following apply?**

- a. You live with someone who is currently isolating because of a positive COVID-19 test
- b. You live with someone who is currently isolating because of COVID-19 symptoms
- c. You live with someone who is waiting for COVID-19 test results

Select “No” if the person has not tested positive for COVID-19 and only has one of these symptoms: sore throat or difficulty swallowing, runny or stuffy/congested nose, headache, extreme tiredness, muscle aches or joint pain, nausea, vomiting and/or diarrhea.

7. **Have you been identified as a “close contact” of someone who currently has COVID-19 and been advised to self-isolate?**

If public health guidance provided to you has advised you that you do not need to self-isolate, select “No.”
